

1.3 Family Welcome Center - Credential pick up

The Family Welcome Center serves as the initial check-in area. This is where family credentials are distributed to all registered participants.

Step by step process for credential pick-up:



Get to the Family Welcome Center at Messe South Entrance.

- The address is Jafféstraße, 14055 Berlin. You can get there by public transport with the S-Bahn on lines S3 and S9. Get down at the Messe Süd station.
- Only one family member goes inside the Welcome Center with a list of all the family
 members they are picking up the credentials for. The other family members have to wait
 outside.
- 3. Once you have picked up all your credentials, you will have access to all the Family Program benefits!

1.4 Transport services

With their credentials, families will have free access to public transport within Berlin A, B and C zones between 15-25 June 2023. Please note that the free use of public transport is valid only with the family credential. You will find the VBB logo on the family credential which indicates that you are allowed to travel for free.

The families should buy a proper ticket for their travel from the airport or from the hotel to the Family Welcome Center before picking up their credentials. Also, this service will expire with the closing of the Games and will not be effective from 26 June 2023.

Note: Family members who attend the golf competitions received extra information on how to travel to the venue. The venue is outside of the free access with the credentials.

1.5 Family Areas

Family Welcome Center

All registered family members can access the Family Welcome Center.

However, when the families pick up their credentials, we strongly encourage that only one family member goes inside the Welcome Center with a list of all the family members they are picking up the credentials for. It would help the credential distribution process to be quicker and safer as well as avoid any inconvenience occurring by overcrowding.

Honored Guest and Family Lounge

Every venue has an Honored Guest and Family Lounge. The lounge opens 30 minutes before the first competition starts and closes after the last competition or the Award Ceremonies of the day.

If you have any questions about the Family Program, you will find family volunteers there.

The family members with the credentials can access the Honored Guest and Family Lounges, which serve as places to rest, come together and network.

Light refreshments are served in the lounges and information desks are available.

Food and Beverages

Light snacks and drinks are offered in the Honored Guest and Family Lounges. Families can buy meals and drinks at the concession stands at most competition venues.









Opening and Closing ceremonies

Family members receive a free ticket for the Opening Ceremony via e-mail from our ticket provider vivenu. The tickets were sent on 22 May 2023 to the e-mail address that was used in the registration for the Family Program. Please check your spam folder, if you did not receive it.

Families must enter the venue from the East Entrance. Families will have free seating in the block mentioned on the ticket.

Families can access the Closing Ceremony with their credentials. The Closing Ceremony is already sold out for spectators.

Please note that families shall arrive at the Opening Ceremony and Closing Ceremony by public transport. Access to personal vehicles will be restricted near the Ceremony venues and no parking will be available.

1.5.1 Non-family areas

Host Town Program

The Host Town program is dedicated to delegations only and therefore, families are not able to participate in the Host Town Program. Instead, families can travel to Berlin and explore the city with a variety of benefits for the families of the Special Olympics World Games.

Field of Play

Family members are never allowed on the field of play for any reason. This applies throughout the competition period including the Award Ceremonies. This is for the safety and security of our athletes and staff

Delegation hotel

Delegation hotels are strictly limited only to the delegation member. This is for the safety and security of our athletes and staff. In case family members have concerns about their athletes, they should contact their athletes' coach or Head of Delegation directly.

Delegation Dining Halls

Delegation Dining Halls are strictly limited only to the delegation member.







1.6 Family events & participatory activities

1.6.1 Family Activity Album

The Family Activity Album introduces a variety of events and fun activities offered for the families in the Special Olympics World Games Berlin 2023. Families can collect stamps at Family Lounges after taking part in the events, activities, and attractions offered. This encourages our family members not only to create the unique memories during the Special Olympics World Games, but also to win a special gift!

1.6.2 Family Reception

The Family Reception is a welcoming evening for participating families in the Special Olympics World Games.

All registered families are welcome to participate in the event by presenting their credentials. Please join us and spend a nice evening with a variety of animals together with other family members in a cozy atmosphere.

Snacks and drinks will be provided at various market stalls in the zoo, and a music performance and an inclusive street theater performances will be on stage.

There will also be a limited book give-away by the Di Pietro Foundation as well as a book signing by Timothy Shriver, son of founder Eunice Kennedy-Shriver and President of Special Olympics International.

2. GAMES INFORMATION

2.1 About Special Olympics World Games Berlin 2023

Special Olympics is a global inclusion movement. All over the world, we support people with intellectual disabilities through health, education and skills development programs.

The founder of Special Olympics, Eunice Kennedy Shriver spent her life campaigning for more rights and acceptance for people with intellectual disabilities. Today, Special Olympics is the world's largest sports movement for people with intellectual disabilities, with more than 5 million athletes in 174 countries, and is officially recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC).

From 17 to 25 June 2023, the Special Olympics World Games 2023 will take place in Berlin, for the first time in Germany. As the world's largest inclusive sporting event, they are a major highlight for up to 7,000 athletes, 26 sports, 190 athletes and unified partners, 6,000 family members, and 16,000 volunteers.

It will be a colorful celebration promoting more recognition and inclusion of people with intellectual disabilities, by athletes and for athletes.




2.5 Berlin 2023 Mobile App & Free Wi-Fi

2.7 Medical services

Berlin and its surrounding areas have an emergency care system that is based on well-trained paramedics, swift emergency transports and efficient emergency rooms.

In case of an emergency at a venue, there will be paramedics on-site to provide first aid and, in more severe cases, organize the transport to a close-by hospital.

3. SPORTS AND VENUES

3.1 Competition schedule

Up-to-date competition schedules including Divisioning and Award Ceremony will be available online via official <u>website</u> and the Berlin 2023 Mobile App.

3.2 Venue information

<u>Spectator Guide</u> will support our families to find all the details about the venue including available services at each venue, location of the Honored Guest and Family Lounges, and get directions to the venue.

Venue maps and easy maps of all competition venues will also be available online via official website - Messe Berlin, Olympiapark, City cluster, Other venues - and the Berlin 2023 Mobile App.

3.3 Award ceremonies

The top three competitors within a sport will be awarded with medals, while those coming after will be awarded with participant ribbons.

Please pay special attention to announcements made in the sports venues regarding award ceremonies. In some cases, the awards may take place outside of the field of play, and you will need to make your way to the awards podium to see the ceremony.

The award schedule will be available online and updated during Games time. Awarding will take place within or close to the venue. Please check out the up-to-date Award Ceremony schedule on the Berlin 2023 Mobile App.

3.4 Family Seating

There will be Honored Guest & Family dedicated seating area in most competition venue that all the registered family members can watch the competitions from.

Due to the small size of the bowling venue, only families of athletes, who compete in bowling, have access to the venue. These families receive additional information.

Any family members will not be allowed to enter the Field of Play for any reason at any time.







3.5 Unified Sports®

About 1.4 million people worldwide take part in Unified Sports®, breaking down stereotypes about people with intellectual disabilities in a fun way. Unified Sports® connects athletes with intellectual disabilities (ID) and Unified partners without ID on the same team. The teams are made up of people of similar ages and abilities to make training and competition more exciting.

A total of 871 Unified partners are participating in the Special Olympics World Games Berlin 2023.

3.6 Activity Zone

At the Special Olympics Activity Zone we invite you to join the action: Various activities are available to people of all ages, with and without disabilities, the opportunity to engage in inclusive physical activities, try out their personal performance level, learn new sporting skills and be celebrated for their participation in the Special Olympics World Games Berlin 2023.

The Activity Zone will be set up during the Games from 18 to 25 June on the grounds of <u>Messe</u> <u>Berlin</u> in Hall 8.2.

The Special Olympics World Games Berlin 2023 conducts the Greener Games project that aims to reduce its environmental impact by delivering a variety of initiatives. Our focus is on how we can make the Games 'greener' and use our platform to raise awareness, educate and engage people on environmental matters.

You can help us make the Special Olympics World Games greener by,

- · Taking public transport, cycling or walking during the games
- · Refilling a reusable water bottle at a tap or water fountain
- · Sorting your waste so that it can be recycled

4.2 Things to know about Berlin and Germany

Berlin is history. Berlin is culture. Berlin is music. Berlin is hip. Berlin is exciting, colorful and diverse. The people of Berlin are welcoming you to the biggest inclusive sporting event in the world.

National Cuisine

For a visitor coming to Berlin, a must-do item on the itinerary should include the exploration of the national cuisine.

Typical Berlin dishes are *Kasseler*, *Bulette*, and liver "*Berlin style*". The potato, in its various forms, is a ubiquitous side dish in German-speaking households. The *Schrippe*, *Splitterbrötchen* and *Berliner Pfannkuchen* are pastries typical of Berlin.

The most common snack foods sold in the city are *Currywurst* (often with French fries) and various versions of Kebab. Berlin is famous for its excellent international restaurants, too.







Climate

The city is in the temperate climate zone at the transition from maritime to continental climate. The average temperature in June is between 12 and 22 $^{\circ}$ C. It is also the month with the most precipitation, with an average of 70 mm. Please be prepared for sun, but also for rain.

Currency

The official German currency is Euro (EUR, €).

The Euro comes in notes of \in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, and 500; and coins of 1c, 2c, 5c, 10c, 20c, 50c, €1. and €2.

Credit & Debit Cards

A majority of establishments in Germany will accept debit or credit card. Sometimes you might get charged a small fee for card transactions, so you should check with your local bank before departure.

ATMs

The best way to get a hold of Euro is to directly withdraw them from an ATM.

*Most restaurants won't accept a 200 € note. When withdrawing money, go for 190€ instead to receive smaller bills.

Currency Exchange

The official currency exchange rate is available at Euro foreign exchange reference rates.

The Berlin International Airport has a 24-hour foreign exchange office. In addition, it is possible to visit banks or exchange offices in the city to exchange currency. Bring your country's currency in relatively new bills or they may not be accepted for exchange.

Mobile and SIM Card

To dial a phone number in Germany from abroad works either with "0049" or "+49".

There are three local mobile operators in Germany: Vodafone, Deutsche Telekom and O2. Also, there are also some MNVOs that use the mobile network of the major operators.

Everywhere in the city, there are the official stores of the mobile operators to buy a prepaid SIM card for Germany. You can also easily buy prepaid SIM cards in phone stores, supermarkets, electronics stores.







Power Plugs and Outlets

Germany operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz. For Germany there are 2 plug types, C and F. Plug C is the plug that has 2 round pins and plug F is the plug that has 2 round pins with 2 earth clips on the side.





Waste Management

At the Special Olympics World Games, we will comply with all the environmental policies and procedures, and waste separation will be done as per required standards.

Competition venues and Non-Competition venues will be provided with all the required bins of different capacity. Please note that in Germany, waste is separated into different colored bins: yellow, blue, black, and brown.

Transport in Berlin

Public transport in Berlin includes S-Bahn, U-Bahn, Tram, Bus, and Ferry. The Verkehrs-Verbund Berlin-Brandenburg (VBB) is responsible for a uniform ticket and for passenger information for the entire public transport system.

The VBB, the BVG and the S-Bahn provide timetable information, VBB App, Rail and subway network map and construction site information on their websites.

The competition tickets for the spectators and the Credentials for the Special Olympics World Games Berlin 2023 are the free tickets for public transport within its valid hours. The ticket is valid in the tariff zone Berlin ABC (Berlin and surrounding area, for example Potsdam) on the day of the event until 3 a.m. of the following day.

The VBB logo on the tickets and the Credentials indicates that you are allowed to travel for free.

E-scooters: e-scooters are the latest form of electric mobility on Berlin's streets. They are suitable for covering shorter distances quickly and comfortably. In Berlin, the electric scooters are approved by the sharing operators like Lime, Bird or Tier.
